
Local Revenue Measure Results March 2024

There were over 130 local measures on the March 5, 2024 election in California. Among these were 86 measures affecting local taxes, fees or charges.

Among the 86 measures were 51 school measures including 40 school bond measures seeking a total of \$3.9 billion in school construction bond financing. There were 35 city, county and special district fiscal measures including 18 majority vote measures and 17 special taxes and bond measures requiring two-thirds voter approval. Among these were 17 add-on sales tax measures and 11 parcel taxes.





Election Results

With over 7.7 million votes cast and about 56,000 votes still to count statewide, most contests can be called. With millions of ballots counted after the initial election night returns, eight tax or bond measures flipped, seven from fail to pass, one from pass to fail.



California Local Tax & Bond Measures March 2024



School Measures: Bonds and Parcel Taxes

School bonds are used for capital facilities and involve a borrowing that is paid back over time with an increase in the *ad valorem* property tax rate. The passage rate this election for school bonds is lower than in prior elections.

Parcel taxes are non-ad valorem (rate per parcel) taxes. Proceeds from parcel taxes may be used to pay for operations.

Parcel taxes are non ad-valorem taxes on property (rate per parcel). Proceeds from parcel taxes may be used to pay for operations.

In this election, there were eleven school parcel tax measures including eight extensions / increases of existing rates. All but one passed. Two measures that were trailing after election night have passed now that nearly all votes have been counted.

School Bonds ✓

There were 40 local school bonds on the ballot this election, all requiring 55 percent approval. Just 24 passed, approving a total of \$2.962 billion in bond financing for new school facilities. Two measures that were trailing after election night have passed with nearly all votes counted. The Wheatland UHSD SFID#1 measure trails by just 8 votes and is still too close to call.



General Obligation Bonds ✓

There were two non-school general obligation bonds. Both passed. The Pajaro Health Care District measure was failing after election night but has now passed with nearly all votes counted.

Parcel Taxes and Special Taxes (non-school) ✓

There were eleven non-school parcel taxes all placed on the ballot by city councils or special district governing boards, requiring two-thirds voter approval. All but three were extensions/increases of existing rates. Eight appear to have passed. The current county on the Rincon Ranch measure is 38 yes of 57 ballots, exactly two-thirds and too close to call. The Orange Cove measure is also too close to call. It is just a few votes short (340 of 512) with 2025 ballots left to count in the county.

Local Add-On Sales Taxes (Transaction and Use Taxes) ✓

Voters in eight cities and one county unincorporated area considered general purpose majority vote add-on sales tax rates ranging from 1/2 percent to one percent. All but one appear have passed. The City of Bell's Measure, narrowly passing after election night, has now failed.

Pomona voters considered dueling measures regarding the extension of their previously approved ¾ cent add-on transactions tax. Measure P prevailed, extend the ¾ percent tax without sunset.

Five add-on sales tax measures were placed on the ballot by citizens' initiative. Under recent court rulings, the Proposition 218 state constitutional requirement for a two-thirds vote for a special tax does not apply to a measure placed on the ballot by citizens' initiative. Nevertheless, the measures in Amador City and Merced achieved more than two-thirds approval.

The sales tax for the California state university in Fresno County was defeated. This would have been an unprecedented use of local sales taxes for a state program.

Vehicle Registration Taxes ✓

Two counties submitted measures to continue existing local vehicle registration taxes used for abandoned vehicle abatement. Since Proposition 26 of 2010, these are now legally taxes - not fees - and require two-thirds voter approval to increase or extend. Mendocino's measure passed but Calaveras' measure narrowly failed.

Other Municipal Measures of Note ✓

Voters in five cities considered having city councils appoint city clerk and treasurer positions rather than having them elected. Only the measure in Martinez, with active support from that city's currently elected City Clerk, passed.

The City of Santa Clara remains the only city in California to elect it's police chief. Voters in Lassen County turned back a proposal to improve the professionalism of important county financial functions by consolidating the Auditor, Controller, Tax Collector and Treasurer office and making that office appointed, rather than elected. The idea was not popular with the voters.
