

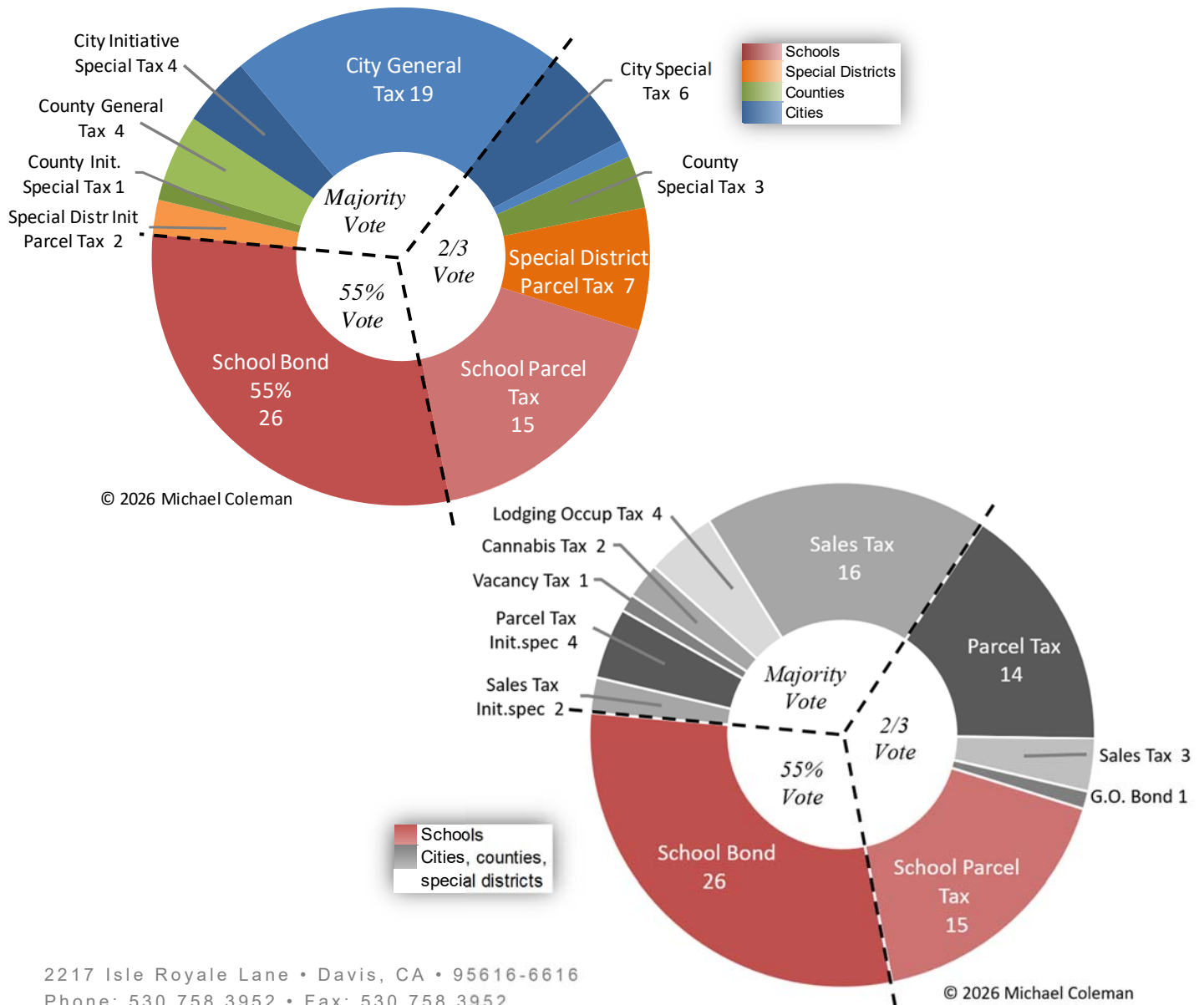
# Local Revenue Measure Results June 2026

NOTE: Final certified results will be available once all the votes have been tabulated and reported by elections officials. The results are likely to change for some measures.

There were over 110 local measures on the June 2, 2026 election in California. Among these were 88 measures affecting local taxes, fees or charges.

Among the 88 measures were 41 school measures including 26 school bond measures seeking a total of \$3.0 billion in school construction bond financing. There were 15 school parcel tax measures. There were 47 city, county and special district fiscal measures including 30 majority vote measures and 17 special taxes and bond measures requiring two-thirds voter approval. Among these were 21 add-on sales tax measures and 18 parcel taxes.

# Preliminary Election Results

Based on election night tallies with more than half of votes cast still to be counted, 53 of the 88 tax or bond measures have passed. While this 60 percent passing rate is below most primary elections over the past 20 years, a large number of ballots have not yet been tallied and reported. By law, final results will be certified by each county elections office no later than July 3. Several races are too close to call and it is to be expected that some results will change with the final tallies.

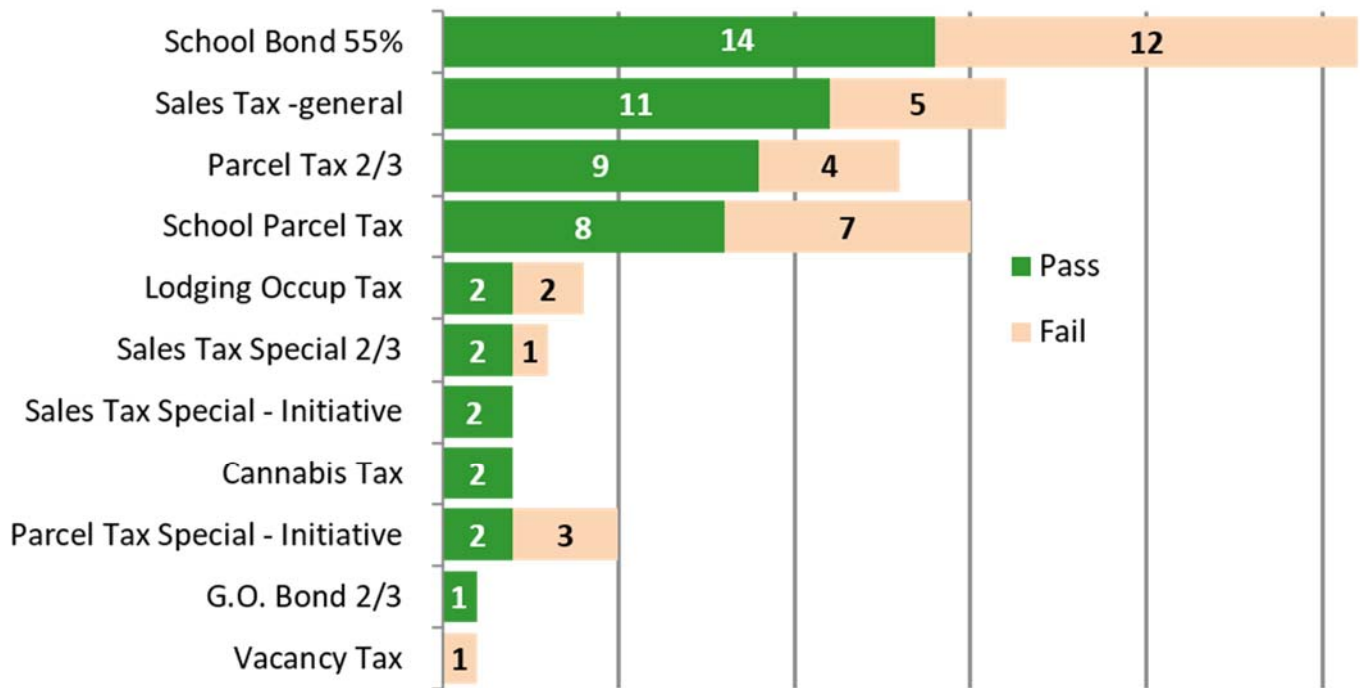

## School Measures: Bonds and Parcel Taxes

School bonds are used for capital facilities and involve a borrowing that is paid back over time with an increase in the *ad valorem* property tax rate. The passage rate this election for school bonds appears to be lower than in prior elections, although many are initially too close to call.

Parcel taxes are non-*ad valorem* (rate per parcel) taxes. Proceeds from parcel taxes may be used to pay for operations.

### School Bonds ✓

There were 26 local school bonds on the ballot this election, all requiring 55 percent approval, requesting over \$3.0 Billion in bond authorizations. Thirteen appear to have passed with a strong chance for three more, approving a total of over \$1.05 billion in bond financing for new school facilities.

## **School Parcel Taxes ✓**

Parcel taxes are non ad-valorem taxes on property (rate per parcel). Proceeds from parcel taxes may be used to pay for operations. Parcel taxes are special taxes, requiring two-thirds voter approval.<sup>1</sup>

In this election, there were 15 school parcel tax measures. Seven appear to have passed.

Five parcel tax measures were placed on the ballot by citizens' initiative. Under recent court rulings, these measures require majority voter approval. The state constitutional requirement for a two-thirds vote for a special tax does not apply to a measure placed on the ballot by citizens' initiative. The two measures special district passed.

Two add-on sales tax measures were placed on the ballot by citizens' initiative. Under recent court rulings, these measures require majority voter approval. The state constitutional requirement for a two-thirds vote for a special tax does not apply to a measure placed on the ballot by citizens' initiative.

Both measures passed. The Sonoma-Marín Measure B sales tax rate extension even exceeded the two-thirds approval level.
